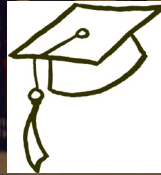

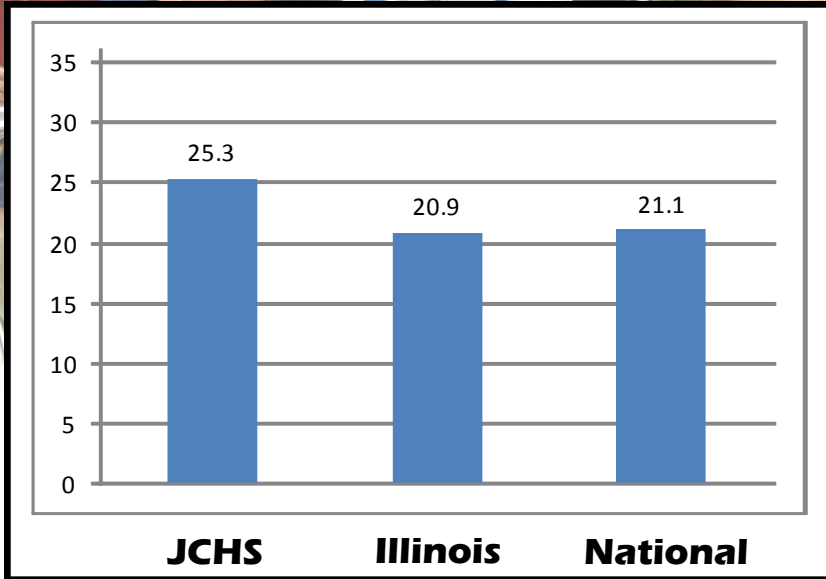

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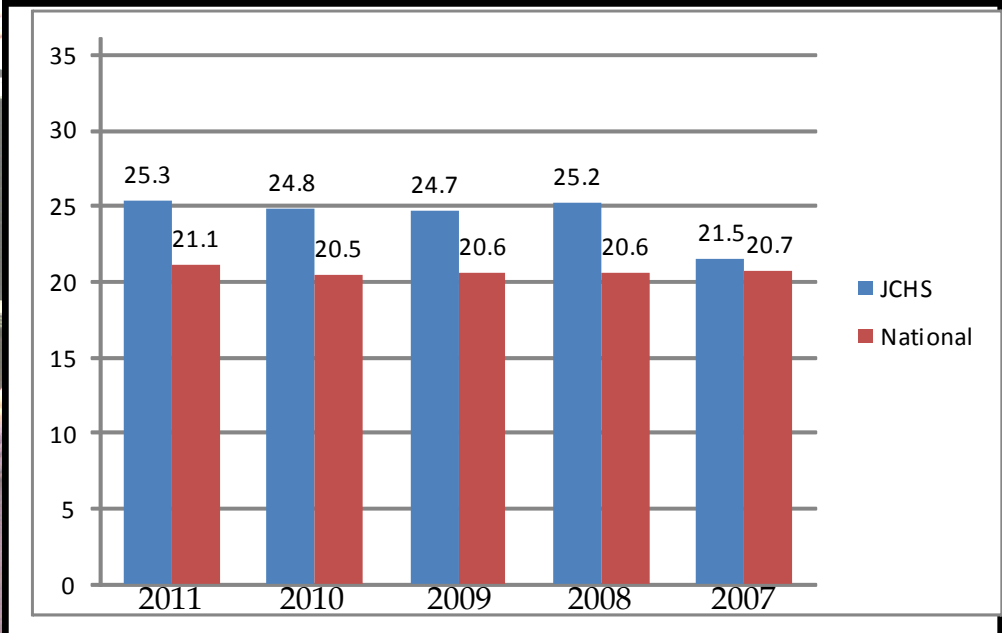

Average ACT Score

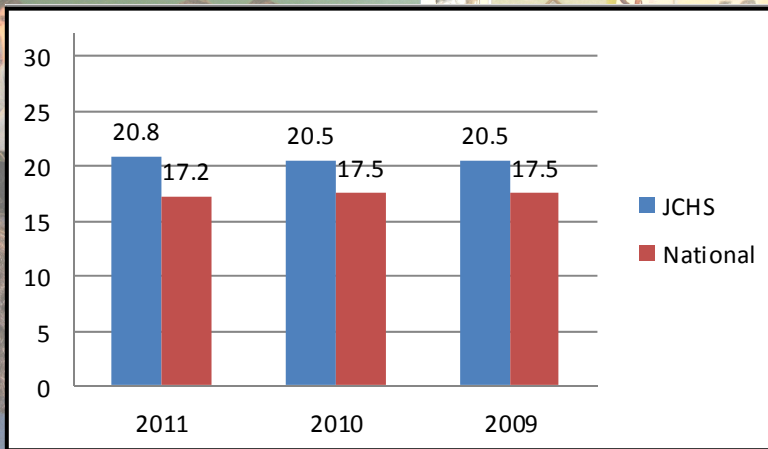


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Over the past five years, each Judah Christian High School senior class has consistently scored higher on the ACT than the national average

Minimum Requirements

Math: 3 units (Algebra 1; [Alg 1A-1 yr; Alg 1B-1 yr]; Geometry; Intermediate Algebra, Algebra 2 w/Trig; Math Electives—Statistics (1 sem); Business Math (1sem) These electives may count as math classes or electives classes, but do not count as both at the same time.)

English: 4 Units (Intro to Lit; American Lit; British Lit; Communication Studies/Writing Skills)

Social Studies: 3 Units (World History; US History; Civics (1 sem); 20th Century World Affairs (1 sem))

Science: 2 Units (Intro to Chemistry/Physics; Biology)

Foreign Language: 2 Units (2 yrs same foreign language)

Physical Education (includes Sports Participation): 2 Units

Health: 1/2 Unit (Online)

The overarching vision of our administration, faculty, and curriculum is the present reality of the **Kingdom of God** (Matthew 3:2) to transform the lives of all those who believe. 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Judah Christian High School is an independent Christian school established in the fall of 1983. Enrollment in grades 9-12 is 124. Our challenging college-preparatory curriculum, gifted teachers, and engaging classroom atmosphere create a sacred space that inspires the transforming action of learning. Students at Judah grow physically, spiritually, and academically through their increased knowledge of the world and its Creator and a purposeful cultivation of a Christian worldview.

Judah is a member of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and has been granted full recognition by the Illinois State Board of Education. Faculty and staff are certified by ACSI or the State of Illinois, and over half hold advanced degrees in their field. Athletic programs benefit from membership in the Illinois High School Association (IHSA).

The standard school day consists of nine 45-minute periods. Chapel, for all students, is scheduled weekly. A school year consists of 168 actual attendance days. General and College Preparatory programs are offered; students are encouraged toward a college-prep program.

Programs in athletics, music, band, drama, newspaper, yearbook, and student council provide opportunities for students to develop strong relational and leadership skills. Students also have access to a wide variety of opportunities for missions trips, evangelism, and community service.
